Dear Landowner, Business Owner and or Resident,

RE: Removal of the Alcoa Anglesea to Point Henry Transmission Line Assets

Alcoa has awarded our company, Beon Energy Solutions the contract for the decommissioning and removal of the 220kV transmission line that runs approximately 40 kilometres between Alcoa's Anglesea Power Station and its Point Henry Smelter in Moolap.

In the week of October 22 to 26 – subject to weather - we plan to commence stage one of this process which consists of the removal of the power lines between towers 56 to 65 from Lower Duneed Road and Boundary Road in Armstrong Creek. The actual towers will be removed immediately after the lines by the company, Ausdecom. The removal of the towers, will take approximately four weeks.

There will be some short term disruption to local residents during this period – mainly in the first week when the actual power lines come down. But in order to minimise their impact we are advising the following so that you are informed and can make any alternative plans if necessary.

1. Traffic

From October 23 – 26 Traffic along Horseshoe Bend Rd, Warralily Bvd & Barwon Heads Rd will be impacted by short holds in traffic whilst the power line is lowered to the ground and then recovered.

Smaller residential streets in Warralily will also be impacted with detours in place and traffic and pedestrian management controlling vehicle and pedestrian movements in the area of the power line easement during the periods that the powerline is being lowered.

2. Shopping Centre Car Park

The Warralily Village Shopping Centre Car Park will have reduced car parking capacity during removal of the powerline. Temporary site fencing will be erected on October 23 that will limit car parking in the southern and eastern ends of the car park. Parking will be reduced to approximately 60% of its capacity and entry to the car park will be restricted to the major entrance via Central Boulevard during powerline removal activities. Entry points will be opened at the completion of each day's work but closed early morning to restrict car parking in the power line easement area. The car park area will be affected from Oct 23 – Oct 26.

3. Residents Whitehaven Chase & Honey Suckle Way.

Residents living adjacent to the Alcoa Powerline and Lattice Tower in Whitehaven Chase & Honey Suckle Way, will have their access impacted during both the power line and tower removal activities. Temporary barricading and fencing will be installed for the ongoing safety of residents and then removed as quickly as possible, once work is completed in this area. Beon will be contacting residents affected by activities with respect to access and car parking, while powerline and tower removal is taking place.

Beon Energy Solutions and its demolition partner Ausdecom apologise for any inconvenience that will be caused to residents and the Warralily community. We hope to minimise impacts to a few weeks while we undertake these works. This short term inconvenience will be offset with the removal of the power line and improved visual amenity in the Warralily area.
