Development Update

What a Winter for developments in Warralily! Our community infrastructure is really starting to take shape and with new businesses, groups, sports clubs and initiatives popping up all over the place, there's a real feeling of community in the air!

Here's some of the work that's happening around us.

Central Boulevard is A BUZZ!

The Ovals on Central Boulevard opposite Armstrong Creek School are set to open in time for the sports seasons next year, as is the \$3.18m COGG Pavilion. This active open space facility is already connected to the existing creek corridor shared pathway network through to the shopping and school precinct and facilities include:

- 1 x AFL senior oval with lighting, irrigation, perimeter fencing, cricket pitch and cricket practice nets.
- 1 x AFL junior oval/soccer ground with cricket pitch
- 2 x netball courts with competition standard lighting and surfaces
- Car parking area and internal road network
- Passive open space surrounding ovals with pathway network

Blue Bird Early Learning Centre is nearing completion and The COGG Community Hub on the corner of Central Boulevard and Carter Road is really taking shape now. The COGG service will offer kinder and long day care at the hub as well as a number a community spaces available to hire. Lincoln on the Bellarine have opened a display suite at The Warralily Village. The independent retirement community of 174 units, operated by the YMCA will be located off Central Boulevard in future.

The Grange

Civil works have commenced at The Grange and the parks and open space areas are currently being designed. You'll be happy to know that the park, located on The Grange Hillside will have a similar theme to our beloved Mirambeena Play Park on Warralily Boulevard, with some new elements to compliment its hillside location and will cater to a wide age range.

Surf Coast Highway to Horseshoe Bend Road

7 hectares of native grassland establishment between the Surf Coast Highway and Horseshoe Bend Road is being prepared, this includes the areas along the Creek corridor and Stewarts Rd Greenway. This extensive project aims to exhaust the weed seed before native grasses can be planted.

Plans for the construction of the shared footpath trail along Stewarts Road Greenway are being finalised and will start to take shape by the end of the year.

Wise Yoga - A Refreshingly Real Yoga Class

Breaking down barriers and stereotypes that can sometimes surround yoga, Fran's Wise Yoga classes are refreshingly relaxed and accessible.

Fran's says that her classes have "zero to do with what you wear, what you eat, the poses you can do or cannot do and how spiritual you are. It is just taking a small amount of time to give yourself a gift."

When we asked her who would be suited to her classes she told us, "Anyone and everyone of all ages can do it! You do not need to know anything about yoga or poses, you do not need to be flexible or have great balance. All of the poses are done either seated or laying down."

Aimed at those in their wiser years, Fran's Wise Yoga classes follow Yin Yoga principles. During the classes, she will guide you through a slow-paced style of yoga with postures, or asanas, that are held for longer periods of time— which means holding poses for 3 - 5 minutes.

This style of yoga gently increases flexibility and releases tensions in the deep connective tissues between the muscles and really loosens everything of allowing freer movements in your day to day life.

"If you want to spend a class just laying on your mat go for it!", another great statement from Fran.


Geelong City Council have one of the largest animal

populations of any Victorian municipality, and currently have over 45,000 registered dogs and cats. Having pets at home is great, but owners need to be good neighbours and protect the health, safety and amenity if their neighbourhood. All public areas in our municipality have been designated as being 'onleash' for the purposes of dogs, except where

otherwise signed. The international recognised Wetlands of Lake Wetlands of Lake Connewarre is preparing for the arrival of many migratory bird species and not a place for our cats and dogs.

Warralily Bird Life

We have many beautiful native birds in Warralily and now that the days are getting longer it's the perfect time of year to do some bird watching!



My friends from Geelong Field Naturalists Club were down at the creek visiting and were excited to tell me, that Warralily has four Bird Watching Hot Spots listed on the eBird Australia website. People from all over the world can access this website to find out what birds are being sighted around Armstrong Creek. All the best places to find me and my friends are listed on there including:

- The Wellands on Barwon Heads Road
- The Charlemont Conservation Reserve
- Upstream along the creek towards Horseshoe Bend Rd
- Stewarts Reserve.

These areas are rich in native flora and fauna and that's why it is really important to look after these spaces so that my friends and I have a comfortable place to live. Taking your rubbish with you and keeping your pets on leads really helps our environment stay healthy.

If you see any birds next time you visit you can register your sightings too by visiting the eBird Australia website - https://ebird.org/australia/hotspots

WHAT ARE THE RED FLAGS IN THE CONSERVATION RESERVE?

The red flags are placed specifically to mark key individual native plant species, as well as the margins or edges of patches of native grasses.

We are working to cultivate a rich parkland and are promoting the growth of native grasses whilst controlling weeds. These flags help us to make sure we are treating the correct areas. The flags also give us a way of measuring if the patches of native grasses are seasonally spreading or receding in size.

Please try to avoid the flagged areas, stay on the paths and keep your dogs on leads. This will help minimise the spread of weed seed from the surrounding areas.
