The great news is that there are plenty of places in and around Geelong where you can let your dog off-leash, as long as they are under direct supervision. We enjoy a beautiful natural environment here at Warralily and whilst we have many kilometres of walking pathways, open spaces and parks to enjoy, there are no off-leash areas. All public areas in the City of Greater Geelong, (CoGG) including Warralily, have been designated as being 'on-leash', unless otherwise signed or specified.

Keeping your dog on lead and picking up after them are the most important aspects of enjoying public space with your pet. Unfortunately, we have had a number of incidents at Warralily where off-leash dogs have charged people and even knocked people and prams over. Most worrying, there have also been incidents of significant injury due to dogs attacking people and other dogs. Being frightened or attacked by a dog can leave lasting trauma and we want all of our community members to be able to enjoy our beautiful environment.

# WARRALILY FAST FACTS

Warralily Village and Schools Site Civil works have been underway now for almost 6 months and are on track for completion in October. Construction contracts have been awarded so we will see building works commenced soon.

## Warralily Village

- Opening set for Spring 2017

- Other businesses will be announced when finalised
- Warralily Village will include a community hub to be built by COGG. It will provide early childhood services and community spaces. We have been advised it will be open for 2019.

## Major Intersection development

With more and more people making Warralily their home we now have a higher population than towns like Daylesford, Camperdown and Port Fairy. This tremendous growth means that delivery of one of the most important parts of the Warralily Masterplan is coming to fruition. Construction is now well underway on a number of significant intersections that will provide improved access and road safety for our community.

- Barwon Heads Rd Intersection- will provide access to Warralily Village and is scheduled to be operational early in the 2017 New Year.
- Horseshoe Bend Rd – will link both sides of the estate and is scheduled to be operational in April of 2017
- Surf Coast Highway- will provide access to Warralily Boulevard and is scheduled to be operational in December of 2016

# A MESSAGE FROM FELIX THE FROG



Meet The Lampardians. A great example of a vibrant healthy and harmonious community! They wanted to share a good news story that happened at Warralily recently. The Lampardians of Lampard Street had an inaugural 'get together'. What started off as a mutual good idea amongst a few people led the organiser, Laura, to develop a snappy flyer which was distributed to every household in Lampard St. It was a cold evening but soon a small fire was going, safely contained in steel pit –of course!

Hi Kids, I went for a hop the other day and found the most amazing place.

It's called Charlemont Conservation Reserve and its right here at Warralily near Carter Road and Wild Oak Avenue. This is a little bit of bush that has been set aside so that plants and my animal friends can live peacefully. It has enormous old trees, long grass and lots of fallen logs. It is just the right home for all kinds of creatures, you might be lucky to see some birds, butterflies, bats or bees. The Red Rumped Parrot loves to live there in hollows in the big gum trees. If you walk very quietly you might see a family of them looking for seeds and leaves to eat on the ground.

If something frightens them they will call out loudly to warn their friends and fly right up into high branches.

The boys are bright green, with a blue-green head, a red rump, and yellow shoulders and belly. The girls are olive-green, with a green rump and faint yellow or light green feathers on the belly. The babies are a brown colour so they can hide from danger. If you walk quietly and look carefully you might just see some.

Can you please help me to keep the Charlemont Conservation Park safe for my friends? It's easy to do, walk your pets on the paths, and if you come for a picnic, take all your rubbish home.

2016 sees the middle of the Centenary of Anzac, 100 years since our involvement in the First World War. The Anzac Centenary is a time to honour the generations of Australian servicemen and women who have defended our Nation, in wars, conflicts and peace operations since WW1. Although Warralily is such a new community, the land our community sits on and the surrounding areas have a long history of people who have served our country in times of armed conflict.

As part of the ANZAC commemorative project, the streets in section D of the Warralily development have been named after local ANZACs. People who have purchased a lot in a street with an ANZAC name receive information about the ANZAC their street is named after. In order for all residents to learn more the regions proud history of ANZACs we will feature a biography with each community newsletter over the coming editions. The first ANZAC we are featuring is Private Daryl Rutherford. We were thrilled to discover members of Private Rutherford's family are living here at Warralily. His sister was able to provide some fantastic photos and add much more to the story of his service in Vietnam.

Daryl Rutherford was a husband and father at just 19 years of age and already in the Army when he was posted to Vietnam with the 3rd Royal Australian Regiment (3RAR) in 1971. The unit was based at Nui Dat and the Horseshoe. 3RAR joined with the work of pacification. Pacification involved seeking out and destroying the enemy in its base areas, preventing enemy access to the civilian population and helping to create a secure climate for South Vietnamese social, political and military life to develop. This work was demanding, dangerous and monotonous for the troops. It was the primary task carried out by the battalion during its second tour. The battalion would spend between 6 to 8 weeks at a time 'out bush'.

3RAR was involved in an attack on an enemy bunker system in Long Khanh province as part of Operation Overlord (6-7 June). The bunker system was captured by the battalion, along with a second bunker system was

captured by the battalion, along with a second bunker system further south. Overlord was one of the larger task force operations of the war, and was also the last joint US-Australian battalion-sized operation. Although the fighting continued, Australian operations in Vietnam began to wind down.

On 1 October the battalion ceased its offensive operational commitment and returned to Nui Dat. It was replaced by 9RAR and on 6 October the battalion departed Vietnam, arriving back in Australia on 16 October 1971. The last Australian forces were withdrawn from Vietnam by 1973.

Returning soldiers from Vietnam were sometimes brought home at night to avoid those protesting against Australia's involvement in the war. After arriving back in Australia late at night, Daryl hitchhiked all the way from Sydney, back to his home in Geelong. Daryl's first job after leaving the Army was at the Ford factory, this lasted only one day as he was unable to tolerate the loud noise. Daryl went on to work for 20 years at the Geelong Cement Works. He and his wife welcomed their second daughter after he returned but unfortunately the marriage didn't survive. Daryl never spoke of his time in Vietnam until 1987 when Vietnam Veterans were given a welcome home Parade in Sydney.

'Anzac' is defined as referring to all men and women who have served in an operational capacity in the Australian and New Zealand Defence Forces or who have made a notable contribution towards the Anzac spirit.

# MISHFIT MUMMY SWEAT CLASSES



Mummy Sweat is a class designed for Mums who are at least 6 months post natal. The class is for women looking for a great workout but with safe guidance and consideration of individual limitations due to ongoing recovery from birth (including diastasis), pelvic floor dysfunction and other areas of concern.

Mishfit specializes in training pregnant and post natal women from the weeks following birth to menopause. The emphasis is on educating through safe exercise, restoring core (including pelvic floor) stability and sharing take home messages that encourage safe practice in everyday activities such as lifting.

I am passionate about training women safely during these stages of life as I have seen first-hand the impact of introducing the wrong exercises early in the post natal stages. Incontinence is not just a normal part of having had a baby. With the correct care and guidance women can remain active and avoid or fix incontinence and also avoid risk of developing prolapse.

# NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH



There are many ways to contribute to community safety at Warralily. Did you know the Warralily Community residents group are also our local neighbourhood watch group? All residents are welcome to come along to the monthly meetings to talk about community safety and all things Warralily.

You can also contribute to your neighbourhood being a safer and happier place to live for yourself, your children and your neighbours with these three easy steps:

## 1. GET TO KNOW YOUR NEIGHBOURS.

Even if you're not the most outgoing person, make an effort to introduce yourself to your neighbours. It can be as simple as saying hello if you pass them on the footpath or waving hello when you're mowing the lawn. Developing relationships with your neighbours can make your community a better, safer place to live.

## 2. PARTICIPATE IN A COMMUNITY BUILDING PROJECTS.

Aside from safety, community building projects can help neighbours build friendships, have an impact on how the community develops and make the neighbourhood a more inclusive place to live.

## 3. SPEND TIME OUTDOORS.

Simply seeing residents outside and active in their communities can deter potential criminals. Empty streets with residents who keep to themselves will have the opposite effect. Going for a jog or walk around your neighbourhood, reading a book on your front porch, or working in your garden are great examples of how to be present in your neighbourhood.

The Warralily Community Residents Group have been working on a Home Safety resource document to support all residents to consider and implement some simple home security strategies in their own homes. The Warralily Home Safety document will soon be available on the Warralily website, with hard copies also available at the Land Sales offices.
